- crowdsourced, citizen science program
- spatial & temporal data on wildlife migration
- 100,000 volunteers, North America
- 600,000 reports
- 30 species tracked



Goal: Greater Transparency

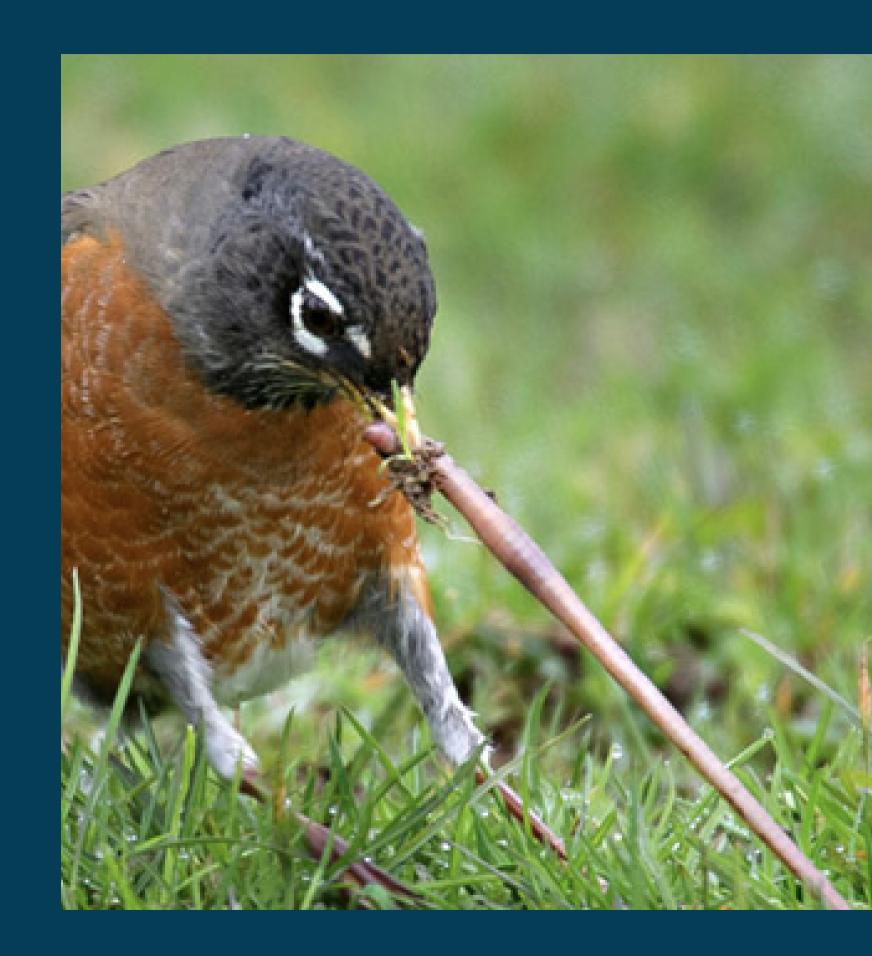
Ensuring 25 years worth of volunteer collected data -- is widely available now and 25 years from now.

Challenges

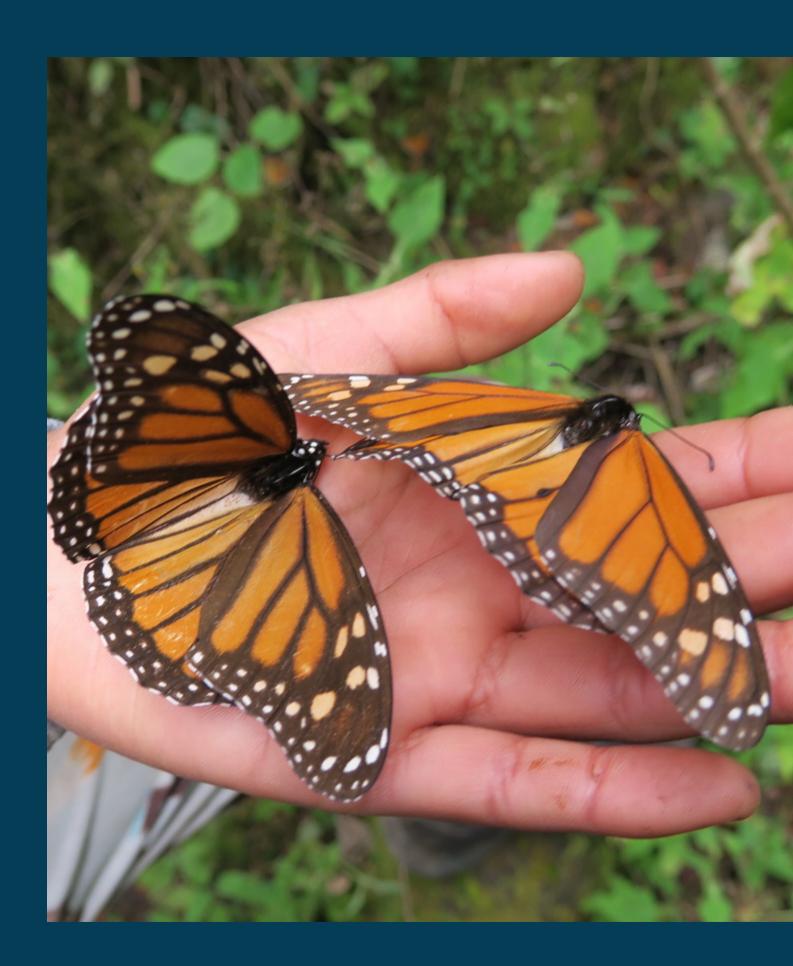
- Publicly available access difficult

- No data manager on staff
